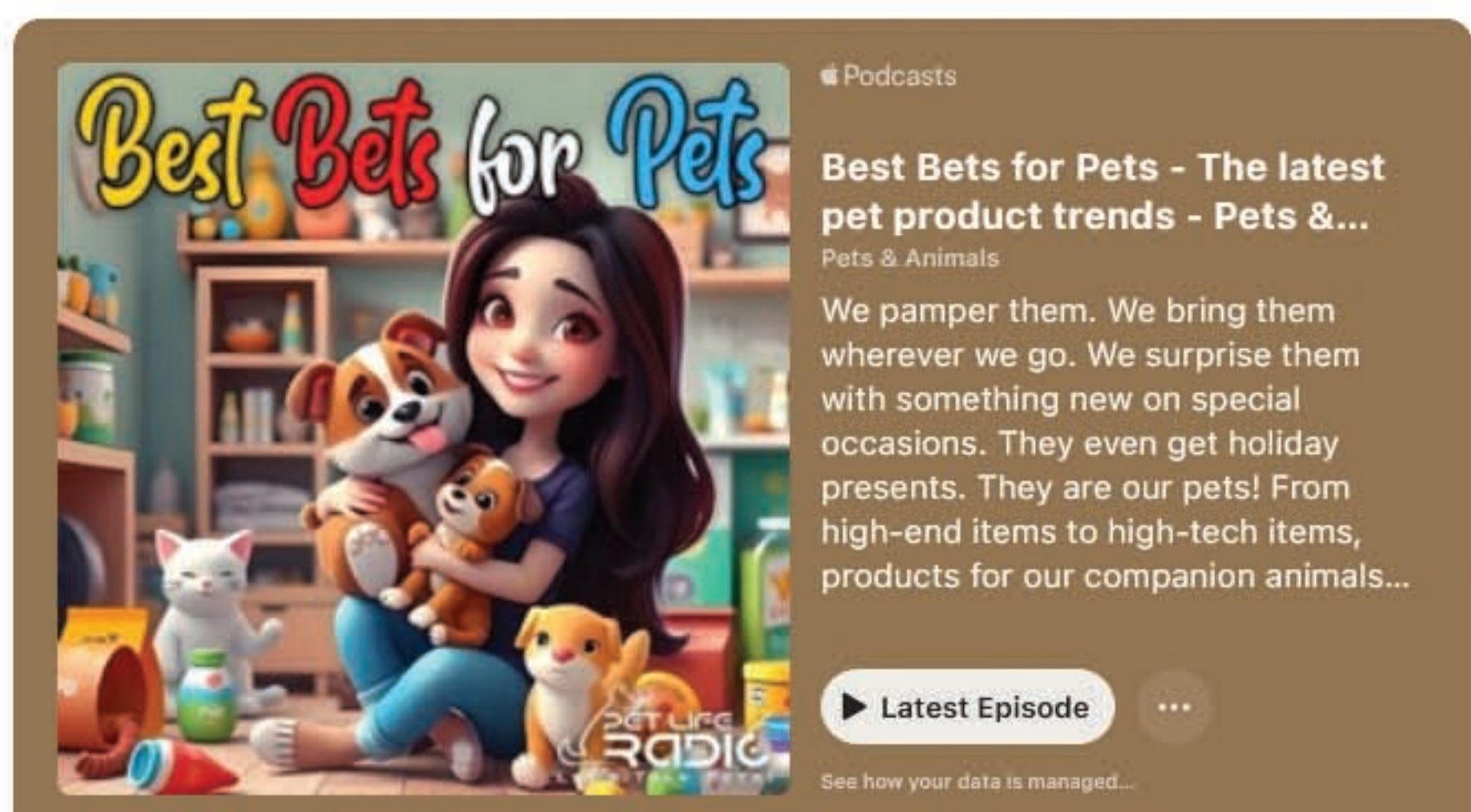
1. How can we distinguish genuinely useful pet innovations from products that simply follow a trend?
